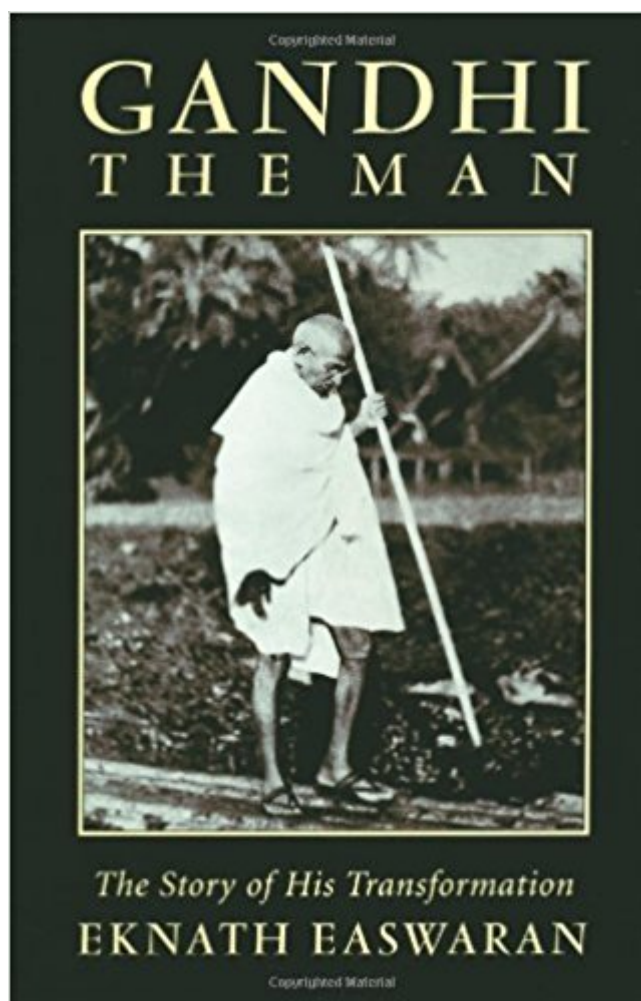

This book is light reading, and succeeds in capturing some of the essential quotes of Gandhi, including his beliefs in non-violence, and his dedication to satyagraha. It is beautifully presented and rich with photos and quotes from Gandhi. Readers who are looking for a wealth of biographical details should look elsewhere - to Louis Fischer's *Gandhi: His Life and Message for the World*, for example. Advanced readers will also find this to be a light (but fairly accurate) summary of his book. For the new initiate, or the first-time reader, however, this book would serve as a good, short, stepping-stone to more detailed works about Gandhi.

I was absolutely riveted by this book, and I usually hate biographies! The amazing thing about Easwaran is the way he simplifies complex thoughts and situations, and touches on the simple, human side of theory and mystics, like Gandhi. He tells the story of Gandhi in straight-forward, engaging terms. There is nothing lofty, preachy or affected about this book. He tells the story of Gandhi as a human -- and shares Gandhi's message to us as individuals, right now. A truly wonderful book. I bought it for my mother and have reread it twice. The ending always blows me away - brings tears to my eyes every time.

Outside of my scriptures, If I could have only 5 books . . . , this would be one of them! I really love how it tells about the process of change of a man - Gandhi - who went from being a frightened young person, to a barrister who could not effectively argue a case, to a powerful, peaceful leader who changed a significant part of the world through his understanding of the principle of love.

I found this book one of the most thought provoking I have ever read. The life of non-violence Gandhi led was so extraordinary it almost defies description. In a world bent on violence in it many many forms, the reader will be moved to a deeper level of empathy and perhaps action than ever expected. Gandhi was a simple man with a belief that consumed all those about him; were he alive today our world would be a different place. This book is a must read for any and all who seek a different path in their life...
