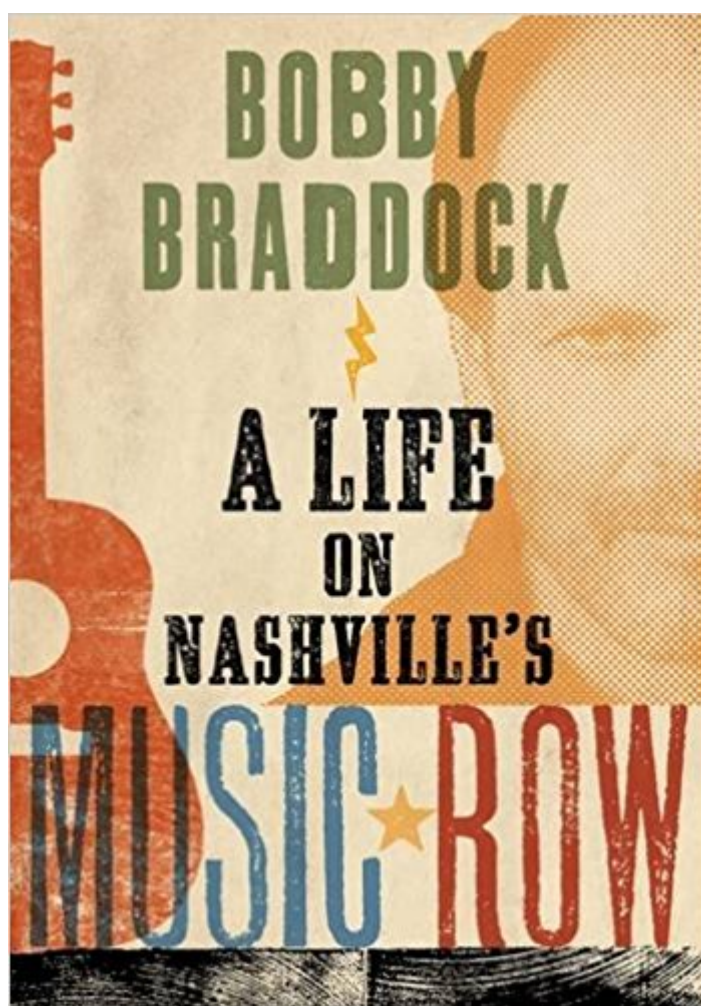


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# **Bobby Braddock: A Life On Nashvilleâ€™s Music Row (Co-published With The Country Music Foundation Press)**

Bobby Braddock is a songwriter and producer who has worked for five decades with singers and musicians in Nashville. He was inducted into the Country Music Hall of Fame in 2011, the Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame in 1981, and the national Songwriters Hall of Fame in 2015. He is author of *Down in Orburndale: A Songwriter's Youth in Old Florida*.

This book is not only a chronicle of a fascinating life, but an important historical document about the complexities of the music business in Nashville from the sixties until the present. Bobby Braddock tells ALL about himself: the good, the bad, and the unflattering. Writing with a distinctly Southern flavor, Braddock's talent as a wordsmith makes it apparent why he has remained one of Country music's top songwriters for so many decades. His wry wit made me laugh out loud at his adventures and observations. It's hard to read the book without thinking about what I was doing when "We're Not the Jet Set," or "He Stopped Loving Her Today," or "Faking Love" were playing on the radio. The Braddock songbook is a replay of the music of my life.

Bobby Braddock and my Bob grew up together. So reading Braddock's book gave me greater details on some of the stories I had heard. The best part of this book comes from Braddock's remarkable candor, some times brutal honesty, about himself. That takes courage and is to be admired; and is what makes the book so interesting.

Truly one of the all-time great song writers. I found the book hard to put down as while knowing many of the people he mentions in it I enjoyed reading his spin on them. It was sad to learn that Bobby during a low period of his life had to sell 1200 of his songs to Buddy Killen at Tree publishing. I recall once watching Oprah interviewing Paul McCartney when he had sold his publishing to Michael Jackson. She asked how he could bring himself to sell such as he had to have thought of his songs as his babies. Paul was quoted as saying the primary reason he sold his publishing to Michael Jackson was the fact that he was offered a ton of money. He further stated to Oprah, while referring to his songs, that while still alive he planned on having some more babies. Braddock no doubt found a real winner when he came across Blake Shelton and able to produce his first two albums.
