

Samuelsonâ ™s book is a totally different story. There are hundreds of histology pictures, macroscopic images, E.M. pictures, giving you the big picture right down to the tiny little details. And if that wasnâ ™t good enough, the text explains histology!!! I find histology so difficult to understand,

but Samuelsonâ ™s book explains all of those odd terms you hear in lectures but canâ ™t remember. My only gripe is that there isnâ ™t a Picture Index, to let you reference a particular picture, and the part of the book covering the liver is smaller than I would like, but when you consider that other Histo texts are just pages of pictures with no useful information this is a huge leap forward.
