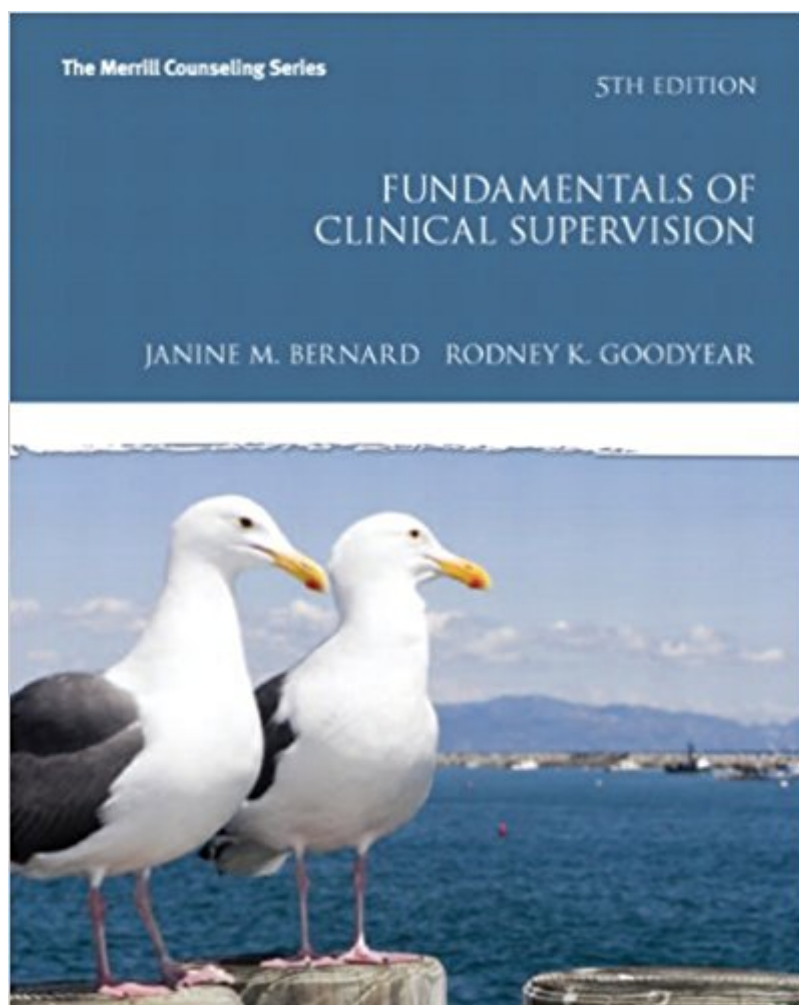


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Fundamentals Of Clinical Supervision (5th Edition) (Merrill Counseling)

Janine Bernard is Professor of Counseling and Counselor Education at Syracuse University. She is also a Fellow of the American Counseling Association and has received ACA's Arthur A. Hitchcock Award for professional service. She is a former Board member and Chair of the National Board for Certified Counselors. She has been involved with CACREP, the accreditation body for counseling programs for over 25 years. In addition to her writing on the topic of clinical supervision, she has presented workshops and delivered plenary addresses in Europe, Asia, and Australia, as well as throughout the U.S. and Canada. Rodney Goodyear is a Fellow of the American Psychological Association and of the American Educational Research Association. Currently at the University of Redlands, he is a University of Southern California Emeritus Professor, having directed the USC counseling psychology program for 20 years. The big problem is that at least one chapter and probably other text has been omitted. This is a problem when this is being used as a textbook for a class. I may have to buy another version to pass my class and I'm not happy to have to buy two copies of the same book because they did not post that they were different versions. They are both 5th Edition, but not the same version or publisher. This is a version of this book that says on the back (which you cannot see before ordering) that it was imported into the US and Canada without the permission of the Publisher or Authors. It is apparently a version that was intended for use outside the US and Canada.

This was a fine book. It laid out key issues and principles very clearly, but I thought it lacked attention to multiculturalism and social justice. The discussions of these issues were minimal, at best. Though the text does present the nuts and bolts in a clear, cogent fashion, it lacks nuance and depth, overall.

This is a fabulous text. I have been using it for over 10 years and get the new edition each time it comes out. It offers multiple modalities of supervision and covers everything from how to set up a quality supervisory relationship to dealing with problem supervisee issues.

For those supervising students doing clinical work this is a must have. Believe it or not there is much that is not known regarding supervisor, but this book provides a good foundation based on what is known.

The book is not the most updated version. The chapters are not correct like they are in the hardcover.

A good resource for reflecting and learning the basics about clinical supervision in a multicultural society. Easy to read and full of examples that help connect the reading with real life situations.

This book has great information, and a wonderful toolbox for supervisors. The problem is the book is also very dense, and I find it difficult to read for more than 10 minutes at a time.

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
