

This book exceeded all expectations. It answered questions I didn't know I had. I have highlighted many phrases over the past 8 months and referred back to it time and again as the cancer journey has changed over time. The American Cancer Society has a shorter version on their website, but I recommend highly reading this longer version in tandem with the updated shorter version.

This is a good book. It has the 'feel' of a school textbook. It has some color on the pages and print to highlight. I bought it along with the Mark Pochapin book and I feel the two books complement each other. This book is rather large dimension-wise. If you want to learn the basics of colorectal cancer then you should probably own this book. This is a professionally written book, with lots of detailed info and references. It's not a very easy read for the layman, but if you're really interested in the subject, as a patient or a helper, this will cover most of your needs and questions. Some times it goes into more detail than I would need, but I just skip what I consider too much for my brain. Many thanks to the authors for such a comprehensive non-medical text.

The information, while correct, never goes into the detail I wanted to read about. It's endlessly repetitious (consult your doctor!) and a tad condescending, I'm afraid. There is much talk of the shame of colorectal cancer. Shame? Really? Simplistic and repetitious, maybe I just expected too much.

This is a 2006 edition and should be updated. However, for the price I paid it is a very good basic guide. Many great resources in the back of the book. I guess what I don't like is that ACS, AMA, FDA, and Pharma industry are all in bed together to sell drugs. There is no real search for a cure only taking advantage of the public under the guise of helping the infermed for a buck (TRILLIONS OF DOLLARS). This is a good primer on how commerce commands government and thereby controls us. Instead of finding a cause for cancer and thus a cure drugs, dangerous drugs, are being injected into us just to keep the illusion that they care. WAKE UP everyone.
