

Luke is an associate editor of the British Journal of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, has co-authored a surgical textbook on principles of surgery, and has written a number of chapters and published and presented numerous

Fascinated by what she saw them doing, she secured her first SHO job in Maxillofacial surgery.
