I bought the Kindle version. At first, I couldn't find a link to the downloadable Mp3 content. Here's the link: <http://www.tuttlepublishing.com/tagalog-for-beginners-downloadable-cd-content> I've found a few errors in this book early on but this is the best book I've found so far to learn Tagalog. My wife is Filipino so she's helping me learn.

This is a good book for beginners. It throws you right into learning the language. It's more like a workbook, where you learn phrases and more while also doing fill in the blank. I would prefer a more step-by-step approach, meaning they start off with the alphabet, numbers, characters, etc, yet this book is the opposite approach. It immerses you right away. A DVD with mp3s is included. I haven't been able to get the DVD to work on Windows 10 yet, but I will try more options to make it work. Check this out if you're new to the language.

Ignoring the fact that they forgot to include Appendix 3 and 4 totally (though listing it in the TOC), I find the style not to my liking. Though it suggests that after finishing a chapter that you now know how to use possessive pronouns, in truth you can (at most) say one or two cardboard phrases with little understanding about 'why' you are saying it that way (or understanding any other way of expressing the same).

One of many books I will be reading before my trip in February.

I have read the first three lessons. As I read other books before, I know some of the grammars so I could understand them. However, for real beginners, it needs to have more details to assist them to learn easier. And have a typing error.

I am curious about why there's no pronunciation marks or guide. Also, why is there no index from English to Tagalog. I can't learn translations from this book. It starts right out with conversation!?
