This is Book 3, in this new series, but since I read them all back to back, I'll review them all here. Lots of human eating aliens, action, mayhem, imagined science, dangerous themes, interesting characters and hysterically funny dialogue. Buroker writes real dialogue. The kind of conversations you'd have with your own friends, if you were as smart as she is. When I read her books, my heart shifts between horror, excitement, laughing out loud and crying. She runs her readers through the gamut of emotions. After reading her books I feel like I've been somewhere and done something. It's all worth it, and it's all good. All 5 star reads.

I'm a quasi geek. I love space stories, drama, romance, magical worlds, steampunk-ish stuff, and I absolutely love this writer (and her alter ego) This series keeps getting better and better! This is book #3 in this world created by Ruby Lionsdrake. I love the interplay of the characters.... Sage and Tala are a couple who fate threw together... They are similar, yet different. This story gives enough background information to make you understand the dynamics, but not enough to guess the outcome of the story. There is action, drama, and a few naughty bits. For coming from two totally different worlds, this hero and heroine have a lot in common. I loved watching these calm but fiery characters find their common ground and conquer obstacles together. The action adventure was even better in this book than the first two, and I liked seeing more of the world both present and past through Sage's eyes. More, more, more! That's all I can say.

Sagitta is my favorite Star Guardians book so far. Spoilers here: I liked the fact the no matter how many medals and a war hero to boot, when Sage's mother beeps him, he takes the time to talk with her. This is the beginning of the revealing that the competent and seemingly aloof captain has a softer and more loving side to him. I like Tala, and her gradual realization that Sage, even as he argues with her, and is more like her than she cares to admit, is a very handsome man and his extremely fit body is something to more than admire.

Sagitta is the third book in the Star Guardians series. The action scenes and bits of sex make the book a fun read. Sagitta, the captain of the star ship is aloof, formidable, and a very competent leader. He meets his match in the human doctor, Tala, who seems to have the same personality as the good captain. Sparks fly and aliens try their best to destroy the ship. This is a bit of a cliff hanger, so beware. Still would recommend the book for an entertaining read. Reading the first two books in the series will put the story in a better perspective, but it can be read on its own.

This was exactly what I was hoping for in the next book in this series. The close calls, the doctor and the captain fitting so well together and all the extra fighting kept me reading till the end. I'm truly looking forward to the next book. I have no clue who will get set up next but for sure it's going to be a great story.
