

For someone that was struggling to properly prepare for the Physics section of the OAT, this was an extremely useful resource. It clearly outlines the equations you need to know and how principles are applied. When first studying for Physics, I went more in depth than what was required for the OAT and this led to me feeling discouraged and frustrated in the entire studying process. However, this book provided clear explanations, relevant practice problems that helped me retain the material, and it boosted my confidence. As in the previous comments, I found that this book will only truly help you in the Physics section of the OAT. I bought this book under the pretense that although approximately 80% of the book is over Physics, I would also easily be able to access the full-length practice tests online. After registering the book and having to supply my address and phone number, the practice tests were nowhere to be found. Having said that, it makes sense that the book is priced at this value since it is not necessarily comprehensive. I would also either recommend getting the DAT book in addition to this one, or simply buying a different book such as the Kaplan OAT Review book which actually includes practice tests.

I am very disappointed with the book and included online support. The book is pretty good. I am glad I read a review that clarified that it is 90% a physics review and 10% everything else (but I needed that, and the Physics review is quite good and clear). The online stuff is what I am most disappointed with. It took me about a week to finally figure out how to register my book and access the online stuff. Then I kept having problems. My password won't work, and the "reset your password" thing doesn't work. The email NEVER comes. The practice tests are just PDFs, not an online test-taking experience, and they are riddled with typos. And not just minor ones either. One thing that is nice is the explanations to the practice exams. Each problem has an explanation of how to solve the problem, including equations, etc. Overall, not impressed with the test prep material from Princeton, especially the online portion.

I opened this book to study for the physics section. In the first chapter, it covers vectors with inaccurate information. How can a up-right vector + up-right vector = down-left? I want a refund. I

used the kaplan book to study from instead.

I used this book with the Princeton DAT book to study for the OATs. This book only has physics, its meant to be used with the DAT book. I found its physics review very helpful. It might have been lacking a bit in some topics but generally I am very happy with it. I also used the Kaplan OAT book and I think the combination of two different books worked well together!
