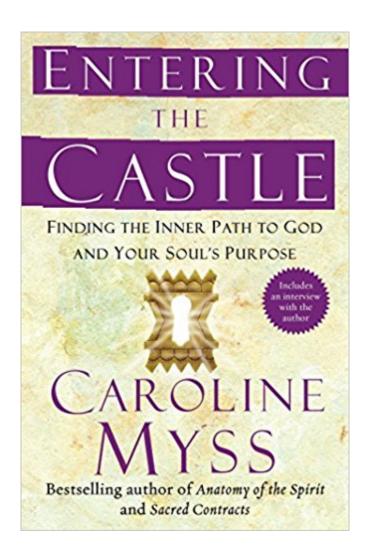


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Entering The Castle: Finding The Inner Path To God And Your Soul's Purpose

Starred Review. Fans of Myss's earlier books (Sacred Contracts, etc.), which drew inspiration from such diverse traditions as Indian medicine and ancient divination methods, may be surprised at how thoroughly entrenched her new book is in the Western religious tradition. In the preface, she discusses how an out-of-the blue seizure and a midlife hunger for an authentic spiritual practice set

her exploring the mystical tradition of her childhood Catholic faith. Using St. Teresa of Õvila's metaphor of the "interior castle" as a template, Myss challenges readers to get in touch with their own souls and shows how they can then lead deeper, more joyous lives. Every chapter is packed with meditations that help to either clean out the detritus that prevents spiritual growth or prepare for a mystical meeting with God. Interspersed are supportive stories of those who have gone before on the path. While Myss explicitly states that readers need not become Catholic or even Christian to enter the castle, some may be turned off by how little she incorporates other traditions. Even so, the material clearly springs from a deeply personal place and every page rings with the passion and intensity of someone who has finally found what she was seeking. I gave Entering the Castle, by Caroline Myss, five stars because of what I have gotten out of it. For a little more than the last year, I have been studying A Course In Miracles (ACIM) which is quite challenging by itself. However, I see Entering the Castle as another vehicle for uncovering layers of my past "stuff" in a perhaps easier way. Her descriptions of reptiles and drawbridges and the castle help to make the process of lightening burdens of the soul interesting and inviting which is no easy task. She bases her writing on ideas that came from St Theresa of Avila, which is intriguing. With each writing exercise, I have been pleasantly surprised at new discoveries about myself, even after

years and years of writing and praying. I highly recommend this book to anyone willing and courageous enough to dig deep into the bowels of his or her castle to reap great rewards.

This book is one of my personal favorites in consciousness expansion and spiritual/personal evolution. I have both the book and the cds, and I especially love the cds, as Caroline leads you through meditations based on Teresa of Õvila's work. I've had amazing shifts in consciousness as a result....but, not just from reading the book. You have to do the work of "entering the castle" consistently. But, if you are willing to make the effort, the depth of the awakening process and personal exploration that this system can open you to can be quite profound.

Once again, Caroline Myss has given us a better understanding of the inner life by "Entering the Castle" of her soul and sharing her findings with us. As we enter the seven mansions of our soul, Caroline and Teresa of Avila (who centuries ago first led us through the "Inner Castle"), Interior Castle: The Classic Text With a Spiritual Commentary (Classics With Commentary)Â we realize that we must shut down the mind, our ego. A quote from Caroline paves the way: "The mind is simply not strong enough to make the journey. Get your mind out of the soul's way. The mind is so busy with daily living that it will never leave us alone, so we must make the effort to push it aside and just "be" who we are, not what we think we are. By letting go of our ego/mind we can find the path to peace, tranquility and a better understanding of our being. Our being, who we are inside, our soul will lead us to the right path and the right decisions we need to make on our journey. It leads us to better judgement of our situations, better understanding of ourselves and others and more accepting of ourselves which leads to more accepting of one another.
