

This entire series has proven to be helpful for my family. We began reading these stories to our son in the evening as part of his bedtime routine. He is only 7 months old, so his comprehension is lacking, but for my wife and I, these stories have been encouraging and helpful. We teach a Jr. High Sunday school class and I gave my kindle to one of my students so that he could read them. He loved them. These books will teach your children about church history, and will do so in a way that keeps their attention. I would highly recommend the whole series.

'Peril and Peace' Vol. 1 is an enjoyable and informative overview of the lives of early church fathers such as Polycarp, Ignatius, Justin, Origen, Constantine, etc. Instead of just dry historical facts the lives of these individuals are told in more of a story format, with dialog and interaction with other people as it may have happened at the time. Some of the stories are very exciting (and some a tad dry) and as these are broken into individual chapters for each church father these make for an excellent supplemental book for family worship times, as you could read about each individual in their own chapter. Each chapter concludes with a brief historical summary to help wrap up the events. The story telling is engaging and enjoyable, with only a couple stories that seem to get a little too muddled with characters, to the point that in a couple stories it was a little difficult telling who was who.In any case, I believe strongly in the importance of understanding church history, in terms of understanding persecution that early Christians endured, as well as in understanding how key doctrines, creeds and confessions were developed, and even seeing how the direction of Christianity changed radically (and arguably for the worse) post-Constantine, and considering books like this very important windows into all of that. It's accessible for all-ages to learn from, and I recommend it.

Mindy and Brandon Withrow came up with a great idea a few years ago - Write a series of books for children that chronicle the history of the church in readable prose that will actually prompt folks to read church history. Their idea is paying off because people are reading these books. And the audience is not limited to children. Adults are devouring these books and delighting in church history!The first volume, Peril and Peace: Chronicles of the Ancient Church introduces readers to the first six hundred years of church history. A helpful timeline is presented at the outset to provide the overall historical context.Each chapter begins with a short explanation of the subject at hand. The authors proceed to write what one might call "historical fiction." A better description might be "church history with a sanctified imagination" to borrow a phrase from one of my Seminary professors.Volume 1 presents key figures of the first six hundred years of church history, and others.Three cheers for the Withrows. Their book is readable, enjoyable, accurate, and should prompt readers of all ages to

dive in and discover the roots of historic Christianity.

I was hoping to find a children's series that presented the history of the Christian Church in narrative form, perhaps even containing direct, clearly identified quotations from primary sources. Unfortunately, this book qualifies as historical fiction, not history presented in narrative form. The brief chapters that introduce main sections of the book and the small concluding snippets at the end of each chapter do present well-researched historical information, but kind of like what you'd find at the end of a movie based-on-actual-events (i.e. "Mike went on to marry Linda. They lived in a modest split level in Hoboken, NJ...."). Beyond that, the historical content present in the rest of the book is obscured by narrative embellishments more typical of Hollywood.Additionally, the theme of martyrdom and the graphic description of violence, found especially in the first half of the book, mute what I believe to be the more pertinent themes of Christian purity, Church unity, Church authority, and the Church's engagement with secular culture. I found the concluding sentence of Constantine's chapter particularly disturbing when juxtaposed with the authors' dedication. What would one find at the end of spears of love? Peril and Peace was almost what I hoped for, but will ultimately find a high shelf on the family bookcase.
