

# How America Lost Its Secrets: Edward Snowden, The Man And The Theft





## Synopsis

"How America Lost Its Secrets" by Edward Jay Epstein tells the story of Edward Snowden and his espionage against the US government. Working as a civilian contractor Snowden was able to copy hundreds of thousands of secret documents from the National Security Agency (NSA) and flee the country, ultimately arriving in Russia. The book gives a fascinating insight of one of this country's leading spy agencies. As a relatively low level operative in the NSA it is unclear how Snowden acquired access to such highly sensitive material. Even after three years there are many unanswered questions.

A journalist's account of Edward Snowden's theft and release of intelligence secrets. Epstein uses only public sources, but he has assembled a great deal of detail about the timing and the people involved in Snowden's theft. Epstein is clear about when he is speculating, but he's also good at spotting contradictions and gaps in the story. He treats the supporters of Snowden levelly, but in the end Snowden's theft was a great deal more than just the surveillance programs that caused the news sensations.
