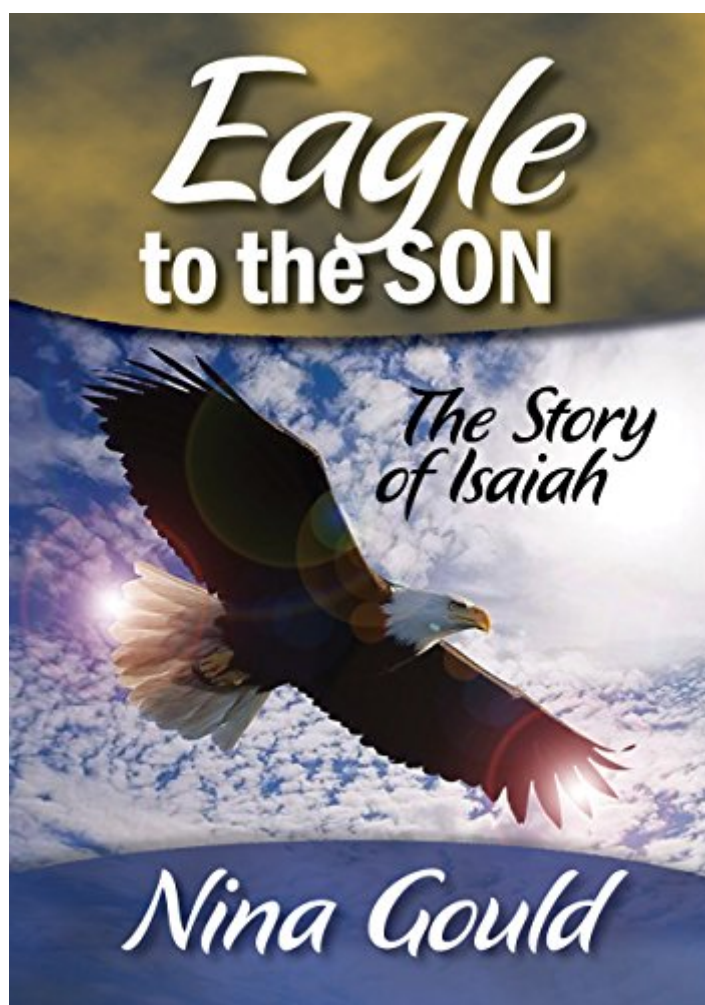

To ensure Jerusalem's water supply in times of siege, wise King Hezekiah has a 1/3 mile tunnel built under Jerusalem, an amazing feat for that era. There are times of joy, with the Passover Feast being re-introduced with great celebrations Surrounded by a group of disciples in his latter years, Isaiah pens his great work to the glory of God. His words resonate down the centuries: 'Unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given' and 'He was pierced for our transgressions.' Also in the series: Abigail: a Home for God.
