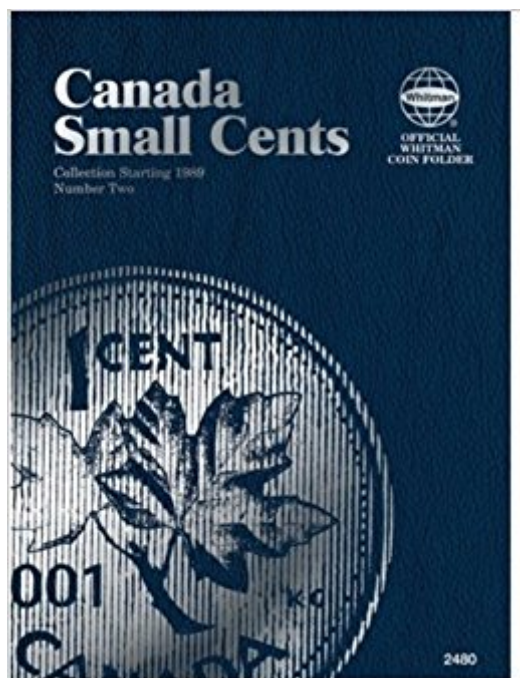

If you are a serious coin collector be aware that this volume stops at 2010. There are six extra slots to get you to 2012.

When combined with Whitman Publishing's Canadian Folder Small Cents Vol. 1 (Official Whitman Coin Folder), Canada Small Cents Number Two will bring your Canadian penny collection up to

date. Starting in 1989 this book has a total of 36 slots suitable for holding the current design of the Canadian cent. The slots are numbered through 2010, though if the Canadian mint continues issuing two types of pennies each year, this book should get you through 2012. The Vol. 1 cent collection had over twice as many slots. I'm a bit disappointed that Whitman only included room for 12 coins per page of this new 3 page folder, while its predecessor could hold 75 coins. The good news is that Whitman does include separate slots for the main variants, which starting in 2002 include pennies with and without a "P". In good Whitman tradition a concise explanation of the variation and mint mark are included on a summary flap (which makes for good reading). Overall, this is a solid product and bargain priced. My cents snapped right into place and the manufacturing quality of this book was high. It is sturdy and as I mentioned earlier gives me a spot to put all of my Canadian pennies. The four unnumbered slots at the end will probably be used to show the obverse (face) sides of my pennies, considering that since 1920 there have been several changes to the face sides of the Canadian pennies. I have an older addition that has a place to display the obverse (front) of the coin but this addition doesn't have that slot. Book two also has far fewer slots than book one and every other cent book I own which seems like Whitman's attempt to get me to buy book three in a couple more years.

My grandpa was a big coin collector. Mostly American coins. I collect a little bit but luckily have some of his collection for my retirement. This book serves it's purpose and keeps your coins in a good organized collection.

I remember when I was young and used the same folders. It was much easier to put the coins in. Now it is much more difficult with the new books. I found I had to try pushing the coin one way, then taking it out and pushing it in another. Then the coin would go in. Even more difficult if using the slots towards the middle of the folding pages. I bought some for myself and my granddaughter, now I

feel sorry for her having to deal with these pages. But -- it is the only game in town. And the game is made ... you guessed it - China.
