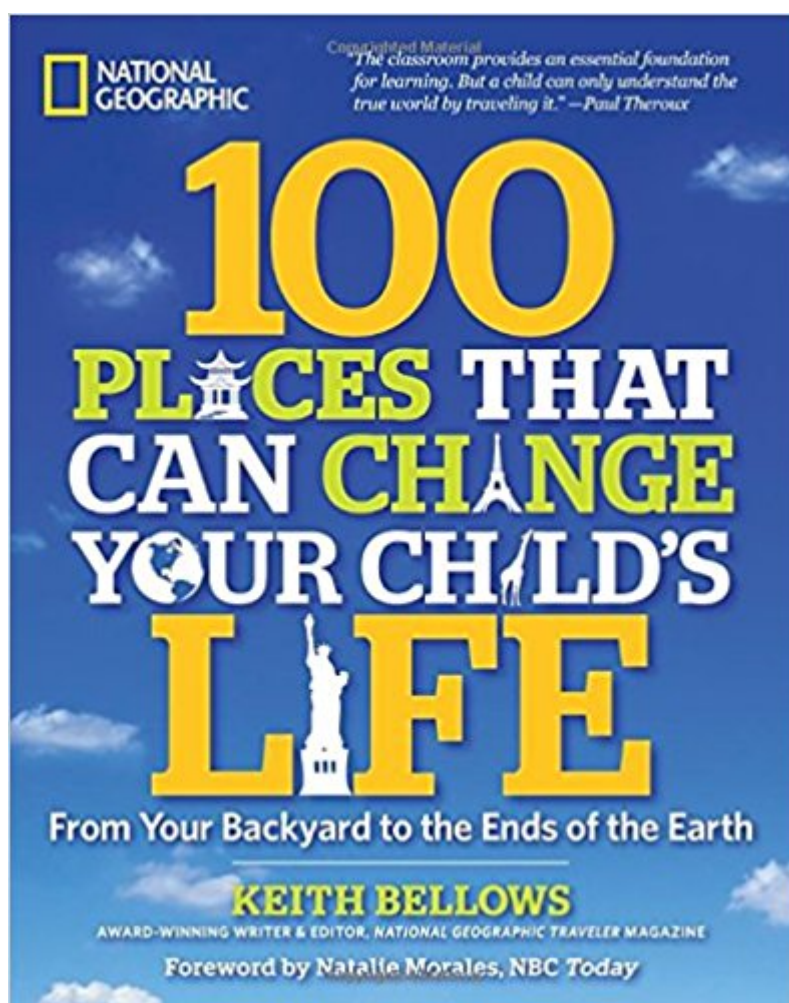

The text does provide adequate description of these places but an actual snapshot to go along with the text snapshots would have been ideal.
