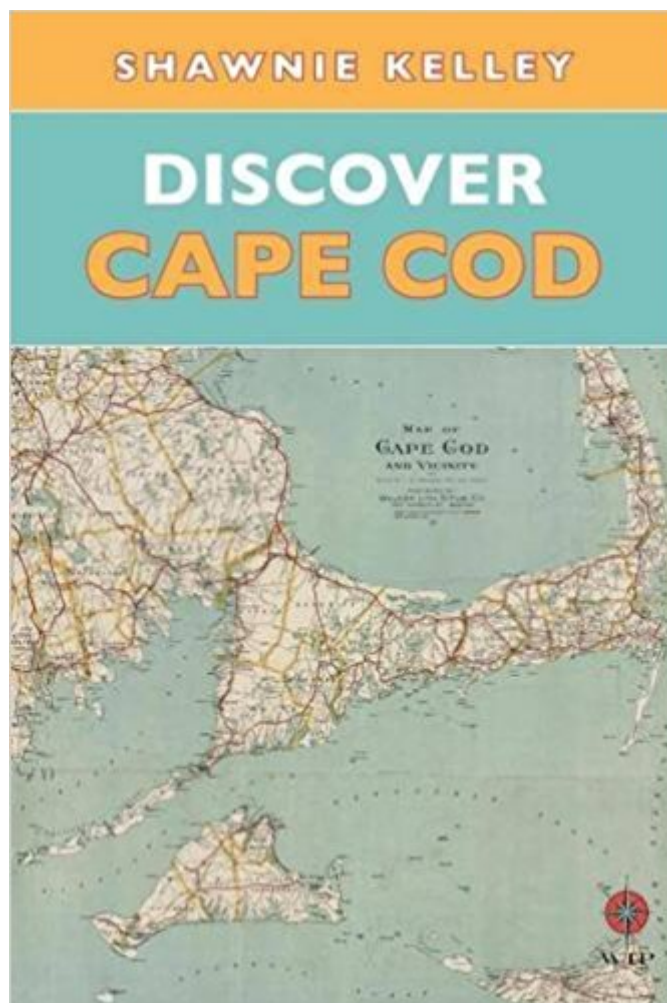

"Discover Cape Cod" is a great read about several different areas of the Cape. It includes information about the history, modern day Cape Cod, and take-a-ways with regard to activities, sites, and places to eat. I really enjoyed the photos. The photos are of maps, historic events, and places of interest. They provoke thought that makes you wonder "what was it like when this picture was taken?" Each section gives the reader an insight to a part of the Cape with the author's notes at the end of each chapter about her personal experiences. It's clear that she spent so much time researching the history, and, having spent so much time there, is able to lend her personal knowledge and love of the area. If you ever decide to visit, this would be a great resource to help you understand where the history lies and places to visit while

you're there. It is a true travel guide and fun to read!

"Discover Cape Cod" explores the history of Cape Cod from 1602-1996. Twenty seven short stories take you through historical events that have occurred on the Cape. At the end of each story, there is a section called "Experience" which summarizes what is available today that a visitor can see or do that is connected to the historical events from each story. Higher-tech electronic resources have become indispensable for the most up-to-date, detailed travel information, but a timeless tome like this deserves a place on the shelf, and will never go out of style.
