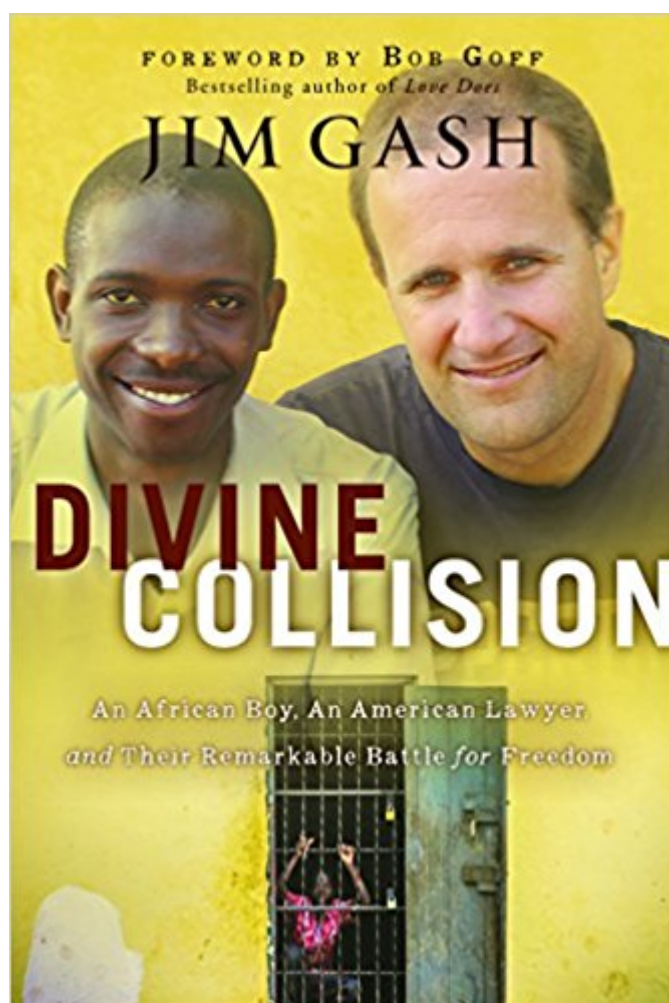

You'll stay up past bedtime reading this book. This is a fast-paced story of a law professor in California who said "yes" to God and found himself on a plane to Uganda, East Africa, having no clue what would result. I do not want to give much more away -- You must read it. I will say that you can find plenty of books summarizing Africa's problems. This one is different. It does not shy away from the shortcomings of Uganda's criminal court system, but Jim Gash's admiration and deep affection for Uganda, its customs and its people are apparent throughout the book. In that regard the book is very hopeful and does not come off as "preachy" or as just another Western narrative of

a "failing" African state. There are many other lessons to be gleaned from this book in addition to the themes of God's love for justice and the value of saying "yes" to God: how to be a true friend, how to balance one's role as spouse and parent with one's career ambitions, and how to pursue a goal with tenacity and single-mindedness. Get this book!

I had the privilege of traveling to Africa with Jim Gash and meeting his Henry. Speaking firsthand, I can say this is truly a story written by God. This book takes you on a thrilling legal adventure from page one to the final word. Their story is fraught with challenges and joys, the theme of overcoming evil with good, and pressing on no matter what. Jim's writing style will often make you laugh out loud and then cry the next minute. His passion for Henry, Justice, and the Ugandan people leaps off the pages. I have given this book to friends and family members as gifts, and one by one they have texted me things like "I'm on page 173 on the first day I picked it up and I can't put it down." So fear not, this is a quick and easy read. Divine Collision is a book you will stay up late to finish, and think about long after it is done. It is a true labor of love, and inspirational to any reader.

I don't have a legal mind; at 61 years of age I am not always sure I have ANY mind to speak of... :) I downloaded Divine Collision because Katie Davis Majors of Amazima Ministries recommended it. But I didn't read it. I had other books to read, fish to fry, things to do. Then I started it and because the book has a number of flashbacks in the first couple of chapters, I decided it was a little too much work to keep up with what happened where, when, and to whom. So I didn't read past the 15% mark on my Kindle but instead set it aside for a "rainy day". Wow. I am soooooo thankful we had a lot of rain this past week. Seriously. Somewhere around the 20% Kindle mark, I was drawn into the story, completely. Totally. So much so that whenever my husband and I were in the car together, I began to tell him the story, at one point checking to see if he was tired of being a captive audience. He wasn't - and wondered why I had stopped to ask such a silly question. Suffice it to say that I bought two hardback copies to give away and am thinking about re-reading the book as soon as I finish this review. It is an amazing, often nail-biting story of how two boys were thrown into an impossibly maddening, undeniably hopeless situation. But God... An American lawyer, his colleagues and his family. Two Ugandan boys tossed aside, unjustly locked up, forgotten. A Ugandan family restored. A nation changed. A sovereign God exalted. IF you want to see Ephesians 3:20, Gen. 50:20, and Romans 8:28 worked out in real time, you cannot go wrong with this book.

I thoroughly enjoyed reading Jim Gash's book, which generally describes his unlikely experience representing a minor in Uganda charged with murder and forgotten by the system. Gash writes simple, straightforward, and descriptive prose to describe his extraordinary experience and genuine sense of curiosity, fear, anxiety, confusion, and ever-present humility along the way. As a result, this work is an extremely easy read and many will find themselves able to step into his shoes, regardless of how different their lives are from an American lawyer struggling to understand Africa. Whereas many books in this genre have struggled with heavy handed metaphors, flowery language, or played out white savior stereotypes, Gash simply describes what happened and his emotional state throughout the journey. Gash doesn't mince words to describe his experience simply because it would be unnecessary, as the details that speak for themselves. Further, the writing never comes across as disrespectful to the cultures and institutions he describes. I strongly encourage you to take a trip through this work. A perfect weekend read.

This book is for anyone with a heart, and fortunately, most of us qualify. If you want to read a story about a relationship begun in a most unusual way, and see how God blesses someone who opens their heart to His direction, this is for you. It is fast-moving and well written, and we gain tremendous insight into the culture of Uganda, and how Jim Gash uses his abilities to make a tremendous difference in many lives, but in particular the life of one young man unjustly imprisoned for a crime he had nothing to do with. Hard to put down and you will find yourself drawn into the friendship between two men who couldn't have grown up under different circumstances. It will bless you and give you a new perspective on justice and how one individual's efforts can impact others. Highly recommended. Don't miss it!
