3 1/2 stars Wrong Brother, Right Match starts out really well. Kennedy Pepperdine, who has started up a Matchmaking company gets onto an elevator and it shuts down. It so happens that there's a handsome man with a bottle of champagne and two glasses on it as well, which is fortunate because Kennedy has claustrophobia and stress-related asthma. The man opens the champagne. There's a little buzz and a romantic kiss and then the elevator is back in business. And, unfortunately, Kennedy and the mysterious man part ways, and both leave the excitement of Vegas. As events unfold, we learn Kennedy is engaged to Justin, a workaholic, who happens to have an older brother, Matt, and you guessed it: Matt is the one Kennedy kissed on the elevator. Matt, a vintner in Massachusetts, hasn't been able to get Kennedy out of his mind. So, first, if you are a huge fan of Hallmark Christmas movies, forget my review. You will love this novel. It is super sweet, has all of the ingredients for holiday goodies, decorations, and sentiment. Wrong Brother, Right Match should have worked or at least worked better. I pinpoint the character of Kennedy as the part of the reason why the novel didn't work for me. For a woman who's supposed to be the CEO of a company, Kennedy is kind of silly and not very smart. Not until the very end does she question whether Justin is right for her when it's so obvious that he's wrong by the mere fact that they never see each other or seem to know anything about each other. But he was her match from her 99% reliable computer dating program and she can't let that be wrong! Also, Kennedy really never came across as driven so why would she want to make the mistake of marrying a man who she barely saw just so that her company could be successful? She came across as indecisive and flighty, not exactly business

competent attributes. Because Kennedy is a bit deluded, she stays with Justin far too long, which means for the reader that Kennedy and Matt are not together for most of the book. The author has admittedly written *Wrong Brother, Right Match* to be like the Hallmark Christmas movies. I haven't seen one in a few years, so perhaps this is the kind of formula that works for those movies. The writing is good. The author's heart is in the right place. I feel that this may be one novel where it is apt to say: your mileage may vary. I received an ARC in exchange for an honest review.

Wrong Brother, Right Match was a wonderful mix of *While You Were Sleeping* [this one is obvious] and *Sleepless in Seattle* [the way Annie was so determined to ignore what was right in front of her face! and let's be honest. Justin is a slightly more alpha male Walter]. Two of my ALL-TIME favorite movies. Kennedy is sweet yet determined. And also a little stubborn with her business; she's like Justin that way. She had a hard time seeing what was right in front of her face! I really loved that about her, though. She made me ache a little as the story progressed. Her fiancé, Justin, was a good guy. I wanted to hate him, because he really was ridiculously neglectful, but I couldn't because he was just...being who he always had been--corporate alpha male [really, when will we get his story? Hmm?] And then there is Matt, Justin's brother. The one who is always there for the family. The one who gave up on his own dreams in order to run the family business. The one who was there when their dad died. And the one who "took care" of his brother's fiancé when his brother had to take care of business. He ties knots, saves loose ends. He's a bit more laid back, but at the same time, he's very serious about doing the right thing. I absolutely loved his sense of humor. The way he'd talk under his breath. The way he'd hold his temper... He was attracted to his brother's fiancé, but he fought it. I loved being on their island and spending time in the winery. I think I would like to just move there and spend Christmas!! This book gets 5 stars from me. And I do hope we get to see these characters again in another episode!!

Jennifer Shirk writes a fun, spontaneous, contemporary romance in which an off hand meeting on an elevator that gets stuck ends in a kiss. Six months later she meets said elevator/kissing guy at her boyfriend's house, ahem, his brother's house. There's chemistry, fun and a little bit of finding oneself all wrapped up in this cute novel.
