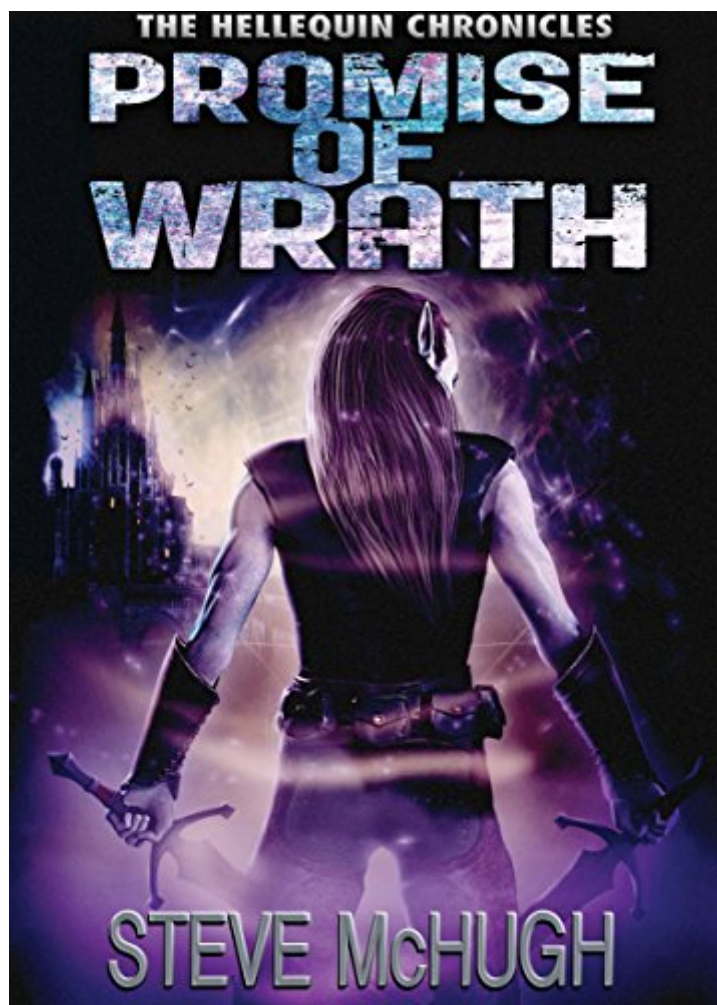

Mr. McHugh does not disappoint... again. I am not a big fan of long series. Usually, any that has more than 3 books in it gets a bit boring with 4th and utterly boring with 5th. I suppose it is related to stream of ideas that dries up with time. Hellequin Chronicles is at 6th book and it gets only more

interesting. However! Should you skipped any of the first five tomes you will hardly be able to follow the plot. The story being unraveled follows the plot from previous parts of the series - no surprise in this fact, eh? What is really worthwhile is that Steve McHugh has managed to tie some loose ends in the way the suggests they were not the ends at all. I was positively surprised with old friends and foes coming back, though, their role in the Hellequin life appeared not as clear and well defined as I previously thought them to be. The world in Hellequin Chronicles were seldomly black and white. With every and each new installment it only is only more and more grey, which I personally love. No straight answers are given, no choices are obvious when the story meanders. I am fully aware that this review is poor. However, I cannot think of a way to write it in a way that would not spoil the enormous fun of reading for every person that decides to buy this book.

I chose this rating because this really is a great book! I've read everything in this series and Steve Mchugh has kept me captivated. As I've come to expect, this book was amazing. The action scenes were well written and engaging,

the character banter was perfect and there were plenty of surprises and dicey situations to keep me on my toes. As this series gets deeper and rapidly approaches its end the characters have become very comforting and are remarkably well written. There are enough surprises to keep you guessing but the motivations of the characters stay steady. They grow and evolve in a natural way and never betray who they are for the convenience of a plot twist. You'll be surprised by many but everything is grounded and done for a reason. I'm off to read the series again, this is one I would recommend to everyone!

For those of you new to this series, read it. Seriously. It's really good. Fast paced, interesting characters, a twisty, history-spanning storyline, and a few jokes along the way. What else are you looking for in a fantasy book series? More, you say?! Well, that's just greedy and impractical of you, and you really need to recognize a great thing when you see it. In all seriousness, Steve McHugh is right up there with Jim Butcher, Kevin Hearne and John Conroe in my estimations, and if you have no idea who any of these people are, then you have some Googling to do and a metric s***-ton of great books to read, and I envy your innocence. Perhaps the best book in this series, with the backstory/flashback tying in nicely with the main (present day) story. The backstory's conclusion was a bit "light", but did provide sufficient information and a cast-of-characters that proved helpful in the present. To date, the MC has primarily been an "action/reaction" type, which often gets a bit frustrating -- always rushing off into danger gets a bit annoying, and continuous action camouflages the underlying story and the general series ARC. I'm hopeful that the MC's blood magic "marks" are repressing a certain level of intelligence and, as those "marks" are released, the MC gains the ability to really "think things through"... This book covers considerable "ground" -- the release of several "marks" plus the introduction/expansion of the larger ARC themes gives the reader a great deal to think about. There are also several statements that are obvious foreshadowing, with interpretations left to the reader, as the MC generally "brushes them off" (at least for the present). All-in-all, recommended reading.

As usual another brilliant read thanks to Steve McHugh. It was thoughtful, funny, adventurous and a real page turner. I couldn't put it down. I look forward to see what mischief Hellequin can get himself into and who he kill and how. I would recommend this series to anyone who enjoys exceptional writing .
