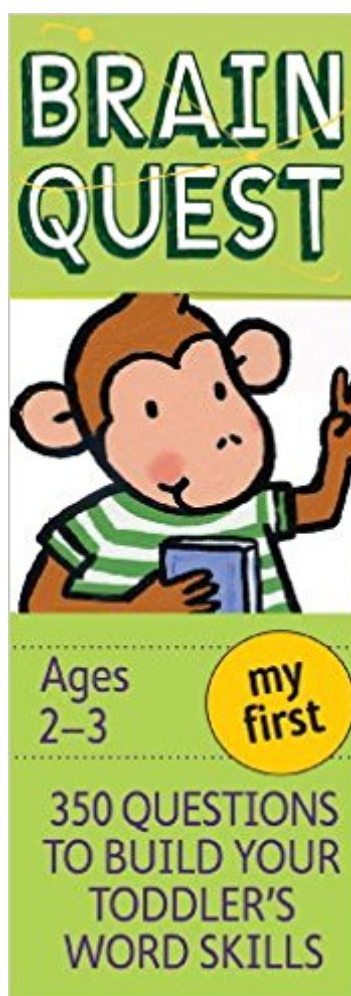

Bought these to entertain my 20 month old son in the car when I'm in the backseat with him and my husband is driving. He loves them!! He can answer most of the questions in the decks but also has learned some new things. He hates car rides but he has fun learning with Max the monkey! As soon as I show it to him he excitedly yells "Max!" :)

I used to buy all of the sets for my now 27 year old. Purchased this set for his best friend's Son. He's a very smart little guy who has lots he wants to say but not quite able to get going on verbalizing his wants and needs. I know these will help. My Son and I were reminiscing about his favorite things and thought this would be a good gift. I was so pleased that they are still available! I saved all of the ones my boys had in the keep box for Grandkids, when they come. ;)

My son is 20 months and can speak and point name about 7-8 items or actions of Max the monkey. After about 3 months hard 1x a week use the cover pages are bent up and falling apart, would have done better with a harder plastic book covers and regular laminated inner pages. Great for the price and 16-36 month old use. Don't get frustrated if your little one can only say 1-2 items, the progressions will be rapid when comparing one month to previous month even with non vocal pointing exercises.

I guess we started a little late with these since my daughter is about to be three, she practically knows 90% of all the cards. At least we have it for our baby when she is ready. These are well made to stand up to toddlers as well, thats important.

He has fun doing a few cards at a time a few times a day. Some items he already knows, others he quickly learns. Two decks. One is sort of a day in the life of Max, there are suggested questions, but the cards are meant to start dialogue (as much as 2 yr olds converse).

This was given to a 3, going on 4 year old for Christmas. The cards are sturdy and well made and have their own little storage bag. He seemed pleased with the gift but I did not have an opportunity to watch him interact with this product. His Mom loved the gift and was very pleased that "Ben now has his own Brain Quest". She is a teacher, so I was happy to hear that she liked it.

I purchased these for my just turned 2 year old. She loves flipping through it and pointing out things she knows and asking me about stuff she's never seen. There's a variety of different things to look at and talk about, you can ask the questions posed on the cards or think of your own. She likes it so much we started doing the same activity with her other books! Definitely a worthy purchase for a fun activity at home or on the go. It comes with a little carrying pouch as well.

I was very excited to find that they made these for young ages! I thought the youngest they went was pre-k! I have been having so much fun playing with these with my 1 year-old and she loves pointing out the items I ask her about. These cards encourage word skills and conversation skills. They have different categories, like "A Day in the Park" and ask questions like "What is this?" with a picture of a clock or "What is Max putting on his feet?" with a picture of Max the Monkey putting on his slippers. My daughter is still a little young to fully understand the conversation aspect, but I ask her things like "Where is the clock?" and she will point it out to me and try to say it. It's a wonderful starter for younger children beginning to learn words and I think she will love them even more as she gets older and can start answering the longer questions. :)

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
