

Huge fan of the author, with the exception of the way he ends his books. Though I did like the ending of this book. Water Walker took me about a day to finish to finish. Not something I would suggest for a first time reader. The book implies you are familiar with The Outlaw series (At least 2 books) and to a smaller extent Project Showdown. Likes: One thing I liked about the book (and I feel like he does this in a lot of his books) is the idea of true repentance. By that not having any hate or contempt for anyone who has wronged you in anyway. He looks to Jesus as the example with a combined element of the supernatural. The ending was simple and left me satisfied. Not something I normally have from reading one of his books. Some problems: The character development FBI agent. Any other reviewers feel like that just died? The character development of Wyatt was slightly better, but I felt like that too just died. Typos-The middle felt pretty repetitive. Not up to his usual standards, but as a fan of the author I enjoyed it. For those of you not familiar with the author, I suggest starting with another one of his works such has Thr3e or Blink of an Eye and then move your way to to the Circle Series. Its clever to see how he twist his books into his other ones.

I have always loved reading Ted Decker novels. I have almost read every single one. I started with Black and haven't stopped. The way he interconnects the stories with underlining twists and turns that pulls in mystery, spiritual battles, the unseen world that exists; and is far greater and more important. And The Lord is always at the center. I have learned so much from every book and some very profound life lessons that happen to just connect right to where my life is at at that moment. I can say honestly that that has happen many more times then just once. I hope he never stops writing because he is so gifted.

I like Ted Dekker's writing. This is no different; he mixes spirituality into a thriller. In addition to the

story it sends us a powerful message of letting go. We have a story of abduction by a natural mother, mind & physical control of her daughter, and a location in Louisiana where the child is basically held prisoner for five years. Are these abductors religious zealots or do they have other reasons? The abused child finds a way out through Stephen (Outlaw) after years of abuse. The message is very good, considering we all have it within us. A fast read, I was enthralled by it; though I found it flawed. Olivia, the FBI agent has a strong prescience, but her character never develops fully. The same holds true for Wyatt. Claude is a secondary character who comes out of nowhere, has no development, then meets his fate. Zeke plays a large antagonist role, yet his fate is very non-descript and barely mentioned at the end. Though our heroine gets this beautiful gift and her ability to act her own salvation, I really think the premise was carried too far. It went to a stage of Pollyanna. Unlike other Mr. Dekker books, I found the ending to this one flat and rushed, disappointing. A very good novel really deserved a closure as rapt as the rest of the book. I'll give it a 4, but it came close to 3 because of the ending
