


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# Intoxicating Greater Paris: Loire, Valley Of The Kings (PJ Adams Intoxicating Travel Series)

Built by the kings and courtiers of yesteryear, these fabulous estates are now open to the public. A Among my favorites are: Chenonceau, the pretty women's château much loved by Diane de Poitiers and Catherine de' Médici; Chambord, François I's king of castles with 425 rooms, 365 fireplaces, and 84 staircases; Chaumont, the queenly host of the International Garden Festival; Ussé, Sleeping Beauty's castle where Charles Perault's princess still awakens to her true-love's kiss; Azay-le-Rideau, the diamond estate on a lake, and dozens of others. Along the way, we visit Tours (cradle of the French Language), Amboise (tourism enclave), Blois (center of historical Loire); modern Orléans, Saumur (equestrian haven), Chartres (cathedral famed), and 24-hour auto race darling Le Mans. Â Sumptuous chà vre goat cheese and mushroom tarts plus much-loved desserts like tarte Tatin make this a grand locale for dining. Famed wines from Chinon, Vouvray, and Sancerre are legendary.
