

Trust by A M Raulerson is an excellent book. The characters are wonderfully detailed and fleshed out, and the author has a wonderful way of drawing you into each character and making you feel what they are feeling and how they are reacting. I loved the storyline and how the book flows. It is told in 1st person point of view with varying points of view, but the author has done a great job of letting you know which character is talking. Here is a breakdown of your main characters. Justin has had a rough life so far and finds himself living on the streets at the age of 18 after having been abandoned by his adopted parents when they finally managed to have a child of their own. He is

underfed and out of money and has no papers to be able to get a real job and with winter coming there is an excellent chance of freezing to death. So when he is approached by David to come and live with him and Charlie, it is just the sign he has been looking for. Now all he has to do is learn how to trust that they are good people and that they arenâ Â™t out to hurt him. David is in the Navy and is deployed at six-month intervals; he is in a relationship with Charlie. David is a Dom only. Charlie used to be in the Navy and now owns a restaurant with David and is the cook. Charlie is a switch, who likes to both be a Dom and a sub. Charlie and David have an open relationship so that Charlie can fulfill his Dom needs also since David does not sub. They are hoping that Justin will be the perfect person to complete their relationship because Justin looks like he might be a natural sub. They have a servant, Simone, who takes care of the house and is a friend to them both. He is also a Dom. Simon is dedicated to helping those that have been emotionally and physically hurt and abused. So there are always animals around the house that are being rehabilitated. Aaron is also a Dom and a psychologist who has helped all three of the main characters work out their issues and will be helping out Justin with his issues. The book is not all sunshine and roses; the characters are damaged and flawed but they are loveable, and they will do anything for each other, and you can feel how protective they are to each other. Trust is a BDSM book and does have scenes of Dominance and submission and does have a scene from JustinâÂÂTMs past when he was a child sex slave the scene itself is not overly graphic, but you do get an idea of what Justinâ Â™s childhood was like growing up. Trust is going to be a series and as such the book does end leaving you wanting more of David, Charlie, and Justin. I would call it a happy for now ending, and I canâ ÂTMt wait for the next book to come out. I definitely recommend reading this book so that you too can fall in love with the characters.
