

I am an expat living in Tokyo with a three-year-old son. I often want to take my son to new and interesting places, but it's difficult to set aside the time to research the alternatives and work out what would be appropriate. This book is fantastic -- all the research has been done for me and it's great to read something written by an expat. Many of the Japanese guides I've looked at seem to have slightly different priorities. I love the friendly way that the book is written and how easy it is to navigate. Recommended.

The content is good, but the organization makes it hard to read. The good: The content is indeed unique. Something like "Tokyo Gas Science Museum" will be hard to find in any other book. It lists hours, days the attraction is closed, and the closest Metro station- Kids can read, and pick what they would like to see (or not) What can be better: There's really no organization. It's just a list of attractions, in no particular order- Would have benefitted from a map with the attractions listed, so you could construct an itinerary easily- Would also have benefitted from a secondary table of contents, where attractions are sorted by the age of children that would have found it appealing

This is just brilliant! Tokyo can be a daunting city, even if you've been here for years like me, so this guide is just a godsend. It's got so much handy info for a family visiting or living in Tokyo, with so many options for places to go and things to do with kids - but that the adults can enjoy also. And it's written in a super friendly and personable way. The tips and links make it really easy to get more detail if you want. There's simply nothing else like this out there, so I'm extremely happy to have it with me.
