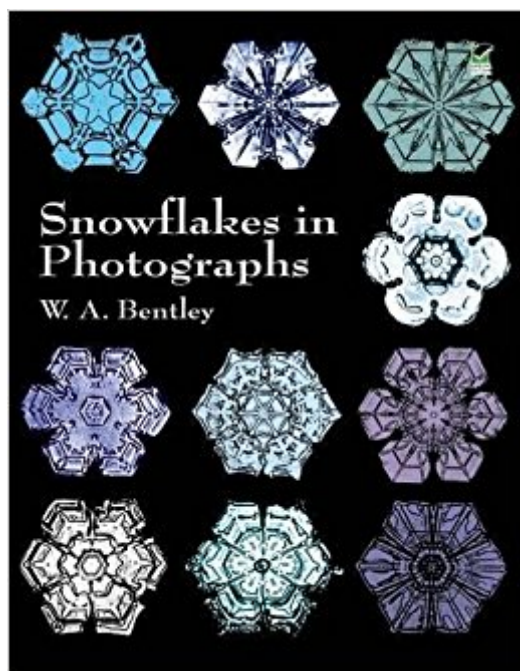

This is not what I was expecting, and I should have read the description more carefully. The photos are all clear, but that's all the book is: photos of snowflakes, just like the cover. If you want lots and lots of photos of snowflakes, this is your book. I bought this for my great nephew, and I think I'll get "Snowflake Bentley" to give him a fuller perspective.

This book about lived up to my expectations -- which wouldn't make it worth it for everybody. In our case, we were doing a unit study on snowflakes and we covered Bentley's biography (from children's picture books for the young ones to more complete adult biographies for the older) and the point of this book for us was simply to see what it was that he did. I explained to my first grader that the large camera he had was also very young in terms of the history of photography and that what he accomplished was marvelous for his time. I also explained that today's equipment is able to do so much more. We turned to Libbrecht's *The Snowflake*-- being from Caltech he's probably a good one to take up the cause and the photos are incredible. My first grader loved them so much that we ended up getting the calendar, *^ Snowflakes 2008 Calendar: Featuring the amazing micro-photography of Kenneth Libbrecht (Calendar)*. The high school student was more interested in the text, and I loved both. Since I was familiar with Bentley's photos I knew I was buying this one for historical interest to go along with the biographies and not for anything more -- therefore, I didn't experience any disappointment for it perhaps not being as good as other books mentioned.

Truly everything God makes is "fearfully and wonderfully made". Snowflakes are a testimony to the

intricate appreciation for beauty .God is the only reasonable explanation.

I love this book. It is the perfect companion to Snowflake Bentley. I work at an elementary school and the kids love flipping through the pages of beautiful snowflakes. I'm so glad there was a less expensive, paperback option.

Book is great and I really wanted it because of the history of the man and his photographs. My disappointment with the book is my own fault because I thought some (if not all) of the photographs would actually look like photographs rather than just designs. A dozen exactly the same size and shape crammed on each page is not quite the same as a beautiful photo showing crystals in almost 3D. In order for a craftsperson to utilize the designs, he or she would have to cut up the book and isolate them or enlarge them. I am not a craftsperson, just more of a photography lover.

The photographs are wonderful. When I purchase expensive pins of snowflakes or Christmas items made of crystal which are usually dated each year, I plan to see if they are copied from the book. It also depicts how much work Mr. Wilson Bentley put into his life and work which no one believed in. A great book for children is SNOWFLAKE BENTLEY.
