

Some of the entries on self-reliance and promoting freedom are fabulous and the book provides plenty of links and resources for further information. Many times, I found myself putting the book down to go to the computer and follow up on an idea or product. It should be noted, however, that readers should be careful in their approach.

Fun With Superglue and other segments dealing with fake ID's could get you in significant trouble for little benefit. One of the most valuable aspects of this book was that it made me think about practical aspects of Freedom and Revolution.
